The Curriculum



Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance

Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance (CEIAG) is central to the work of Belfast Bovs' Model School in effectively preparing pupils to progress to successful futures. We work in partnership with a wide range of organisations, including Employers, Universities and Further Education Colleges to ensure the delivery of high quality, up-to-date Careers provision across the school. This ensures that pupils are well prepared to make informed choices about their future education, training and employment.



Preparation for Life Beyond Belfast Boys' Model School

Pupils who leave Belfast Boys' Model School continue to study a wide range of degree subjects and higher level qualifications at institutions across the UK and further afield.

The vast majority of our senior pupils aspire to go on to study at university. Many are offered and accept places at universities including Queen's University, Ulster University, Stranmillis College, Liverpool John Moore's University, at Ulster University to Zoology at Oxford Brookes; from Criminology at Queen's University to Football Coaching & Business Management facilitated by the IFA in partnership with Ulster University.

We also maintain strong partnerships with Belfast Metropolitan and Northern Regional colleges, with leavers progressing to study HND and Foundation degree courses in a wide range of subjects including; Architectural Technology, Accounting, Business Management, Web Design and Electrical Engineering.

Whichever pathway pupils choose, they receive guidance from a dedicated team of Careers Advisors, Form Teachers and representatives from the world of work. This, combined with opportunities to experience the work environment and develop employability skills, ensures that pupils can progress confidently to the next chapter of their education, training or employment.









Personalised Learning

Our aim is to encourage and support every boy to achieve his academic and personal potential. We pride ourselves on providing a supportive learning environment which meets the needs of all learners, including those with additional needs.

As part of our 'Learning to Learn' initiative, our teachers will introduce them to strategies and resources that will enable them to 'Think Hard', to embrace challenges to their learning so that they can confidently overcome them within the school/ classroom setting, but also, and importantly outside of the classroom as they engage in meaningful study that complements their learning in class.

Anti-Bullying Ambassadors - We are proud of our team of pupils who are Anti-Bullying Ambassadors. These young men facilitate peer workshops, during Anti-Bullying Week and offer on-going support to individual and groups of pupils, throughout the school year.

An excellent Pastoral programme is in place to address the key issues facing young people and assist in the development of resilience and emotional intelligence.

We have recently introduced a Wellbeing class into our curriculum. This focuses on developing the physical, social and emotional wellbeing of our pupils



- help identify and remove barriers to learning


The FSES provision includes:-


